## Feline Vaccines

Vaccine	Age	Description
<b>Feline Distemper (FVRCP)</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• As early as 6 weeks</li><li>• Booster every 3-4 weeks until 16 weeks old</li><li>• Booster yearly if * high risk or every 3 years</li></ul>	Feline viral Rhinotracheitis is a highly contagious and severe upper respiratory infection; Calicivirus is a highly contagious and severe upper respiratory infection. Panleukopenia is highly contagious, initially presents as vomiting/diarrhea but then progress to suppression of all blood cell lines
<b>Feline Leukemia (FeLV)</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• As early as 9 weeks</li><li>• Booster every 3-4 weeks until 16 weeks</li><li>• Booster yearly if *high risk or every 3 years</li></ul>	Viral disease that attacks the immune system and leaves the cat vulnerable to a host of secondary infections. Transmission usually occurs through contact with other felines. Usually fatal.
<b>Rabies</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• No earlier than 3 months old and before 6 months old</li><li>• Booster is required in 1 year with a 3 year certificate</li><li>• Then booster every 3 years</li></ul>	Fatal viral disease of all mammals including dogs, cats, livestock and humans. Infected wildlife and unvaccinated animals are the source of this virus.

\*High risk- show dogs, free roaming, dogs being boarded or groomed.
